

CHILD SAFEGUARDING – 11 STANDARDS INTRODUCTORY PACK

As of the 1st of July 2022, the Victorian Government will introduce 11 Child Safetguarding Standards. Netball Australia and Netball Victoria have created a library of policies and resources that your organisation may choose to adopt.

The job of each organisation is to now implement and imbed these standards. This may feel like a mountainous job however this document can be treated as a guide as a starting point for each standard. Additionally, check out the Child Safeguarding resources available on the Netball Victoria website

Most importantly, note that there is a 12-month transition period from the 1st of July 2022 to implement these standards.

Ensure everyone in your netball community is aware of expected behaviour when engaging in netball by promoting and making available the code of conduct fact sheets –

- What the committee needs to know?
- What do I need to know as a parent/carer?
- What do I need to know as an official?
- What should I know as a Teen

Ask all Coaches and other relevant staff and volunteers to read the Child Safety code of conduct and sign a declaration form – Sample declaration form is in the Resource hub

Refer Coaches and Umpires to the dedicated tile in our resource hub where they can find resources such as — A guide for physical contact when working with Children.
