

International Travel Advice - LGBT+ Community

Netball Victoria is committed to providing a safe and supportive environment for volunteers/staff, players, coaches, officials, administrators, spectators/families, and members. Intrinsic to the netball culture are the principles of equity, respect, and safety for all people in the LGBT+ community.

Gender identity, sex and sexuality are protected attributes by Australian law, but this is not the case in all countries around the world. Every country is unique in its approach to LGBT+ people. All travellers face risks overseas but risks can be higher for LGBT+ people in some destinations. Netball Victoria highly recommends you get the facts before you travel and take steps to reduce your risks. The Australian Governments Smart Traveller website provides information and advice specifically for the LGBT+ community such as:

- Read the travel advice for the destinations you plan to visit. Subscribe for updates.
- Understand the laws and customs of where you're going. Stay within the law, even if you strongly disagree with it.
- Understand the overlapping risks you could face.
- Know how to reduce your risk. Be prepared for any issues you might face.
