

On the 1st of July 2022, the Victorian Government introduced 11 Child Safeguarding Standards. Netball Australia and Netball Victoria have created a library of policies and resources that your organisation may choose to adopt.

The job of each organisation is to implement and imbed these standards. This may feel like a mountainous job however this document can be treated as a starting point and guide for each standard. - Ensure there is a strong Photography Policy written and implemented
- Identify any obvious practices at your next committee meeting that may need immediate attention.
