Primary Purpose of Position

The Head Coach is responsible for the overall leadership, management, and development of MRNA's representative netball program.

This role includes coaching the highest age group team (possibly Under 17 age group) during training and game days. The Head Coach is to design and implement age-appropriate training programs for Under 13, Under 15 and Under 17 teams. They are to guide and mentor coaches, while fostering a positive and values-driven team culture.

Working in close collaboration with administrative staff, the Head Coach ensures the smooth operation of the program and supports the wellbeing of both coaches, players and families. Support for the Head Coach is provided by the Representative Administrator and the MRNA Committee.

- Coach selection, development and mentoring
- Netball Program development and implementation
- Player selection/trial process
- Stay updated on the latest trends, techniques, and advancements in netball
- coaching to continually improve the program
- Attend weekly training sessions at MRNA
- Attend Game Days at either State Netball Centre or Essendon & District Netball Association
- Attend occasional weekend Tournaments (Locations TBC)
- Coordinate Coach meetings on a regular basis
- Report to the MRNA Committee on a regular basis with updates
- Complete and help facilitate End of Season player coach reports
- Adhere to all Association and Club policies and procedures.
- Commit to and uphold the Netball Victoria Coaches Code of Conduct

Required skills and experience

- A minimum of 2 years coaching experience
- At minimum have a Development Coach Accreditation
- Hold current or be willing to attain a First Aid certificate
- Age 18 or above
- Hold a current and valid Working with Children Check
- Hold a current and valid Drivers Licence
