Outer East Football Netball	Outer East FN is a two-division football and netball competition that covers a vast area of outer eastern Melbourne. From the Goulburn Valley Highway in its north-eastern region, through the Yarra Valley and Dandenong Ranges down to the Princes Highway in the southeast region. All in all, 19 different venues are used, Yea, Alexandra, Yarra Glen, Healesville, Warburton, Powelltown, Yarra Junction, Woori Yallock, Seville, Wandin, Mt Evelyn, Olinda, Upwey, Belgrave, Monbulk, Emerald, Gembrook, Pakenham & Officer, Our affiliate clubs compete in an eighteen round home and away series followed by a four round finals series. The season commences early April and culminates with Grand Finals in late September. Every week we need to fill 18 umpiring positions throughout the competition. Our panel umpires officiate in our A Grade and B Grade competitions, where games are played back-to-back at venues on a Saturday afternoon. All of our umpires are required to have their C Badge accreditation as a minimum. Outer East Football Netball operations are based out of the Kilsyth Centre of Excellence located at 95 Colchester Rd Kilsyth.

Primary Purpose of Position

 To enrich netball umpiring standards and numbers across all netball grades in the Outer East Football Netball competition.

Key Responsibilities

- Foster the growth and raise the standards of umpires
- Develop strategies for recruiting both experienced and beginner umpires
- Organise umpire rosters (allocations) and maintain records using OfficalsHQ
- Ensure that Outer East FN umpiring pathways align with Netball Australia and Netball Victoria guidelines.
- Liaise with Netball Victoria regarding umpire courses/clinics/accreditation
- · Co-ordinate badge testing as required
- Identify and organise the training and education opportunities for umpires
- Develop a mentor program for learner umpires
- Encourage beginner umpires including players to undertake formal umpire education and or become accredited umpires
- Ensure all umpires are rewarded and recognised for their efforts
- Work with the Netball Operations Coordinator to maintain records of umpiring services and accreditation
- Liaise with CEO in formulating a Budget anticipating cost of umpire accreditations/game payments
- Encourage umpires to nominate as umpires for Region, Association, Tournament, and other representative teams
- · Set standards for umpire attire
- Carry out match observations and ongoing umpire reviews
- Provide a healthy and enjoyable environment for all umpires
- Submit regular reports to the operational staff and attend meetings as required
