



# **NETBALL VICTORIA FACILITY PRIORITY PROJECTS LIST 2026**

# INTRODUCTION

Netball Victoria's 2026–2028 Statewide Facilities Strategy, released in November 2025, provides a strategic framework to guide the planning, development and investment in netball infrastructure across Victoria. With netball activity increasing by 28 per cent since 2022, demand for quality, accessible and sustainable facilities continues to grow across metropolitan, regional and rural communities.

The Facility Priority Projects List has been developed to identify locations and projects that represent the most significant infrastructure needs across the state. It provides a structured and evidence-based approach to prioritising investment, ensuring that limited resources are directed towards projects that will deliver the greatest benefit to the Victorian netball community.

The criteria used to establish the list included:

- Priority development opportunities highlighted in the Statewide Facilities Strategy
- Priority projects listed in the AFL Gippsland and AFL Southeast Facilities Strategies
- Projects highlighted by Councils as being “shovel-ready” for development
- Venues rated as “Poor” or “Very Poor” in Netball Victoria Sports Facility Auditing system
- Venues where there is only one competition court, requiring a second court to meet competition standards
- Projects highlighted by Councils in their advocacy strategies
- Projects which were unsuccessful in LSIF and CFNP funding rounds

Priority areas have been informed by participation data, facility provision analysis, stakeholder consultation and projected population growth. Key considerations include addressing facility shortages in high-growth areas, upgrading ageing or non-compliant infrastructure, improving accessibility and inclusion, and supporting the development of sustainable and fit-for-purpose facilities.

This prioritisation framework will support collaboration between Netball Victoria, local governments, state government agencies and the broader netball community to guide planning, advocacy and funding decisions.

By clearly identifying areas of greatest need, the Facilities Priority Projects List aims to support the delivery of infrastructure that enables participation growth and ensures netball remains accessible and sustainable across Victoria.

# DANDENONG

**Upgrade the current 12 non-compliant asphalt netball courts to 9 compliant courts, including shelters, lighting and fencing.**

The Netball Victoria Statewide Facilities Strategy (SWFS) found that the City of Greater Dandenong ‘Outdoor Court Capacity’ was at 54%, meaning the non-compliant and poor condition of courts in this LGA is limiting the amount of netball played in the area.

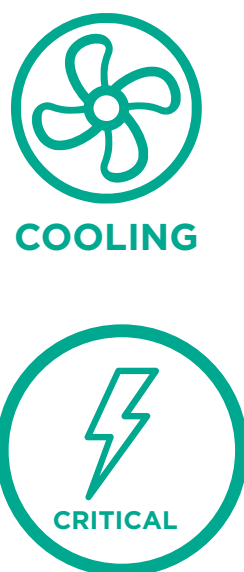
The SWFS also found that the projected ‘Female Active Market Population’ (5-64 years) in the City of Greater Dandenong will increase by 16.8% from 2024-2034, therefore highlighting the need to prioritise investment in compliant, accessible and fit-for-purpose netball facilities to support future participation growth.

The redevelopment to 9 high-quality, safe and compliant courts will therefore enable greater opportunities for the association to expand programming and competitions to meet the demands of the sport and the needs of a growth area.

**Addition of a cooling system for the State Netball Centre to improve indoor air temperature.**

The State Netball Centre is Victoria’s premier netball venue and a critical piece of statewide infrastructure, supporting Netball Victoria programming, pathway activity, high-performance training, competitions, events and community participation. The addition of a cooling system will improve indoor air temperature, enhance user comfort and support safer use of the facility during warmer periods.

The Netball Victoria’s SWFS found the City of Melbourne’s ‘Female Population Percentage Change’ is projected to increase by 25.2% from 2024-2034. Improved temperature control at the State Netball Centre will support this growing demand by enhancing comfort, safety and reliability for training, competitions, major events and peak summer programming.

**Addition of court covers over 3 outdoor netball courts to enable expanded programming.**

Netball Victoria’s SWFS found that Maroondah City Council area had a ‘Total Netball Court Demand Rating Score’ of 17/24, with more than 1,200 ‘Participants per Existing Equivalent Court’. This indicates strong pressure on existing court provision and highlights the need to maximise the use of existing netball infrastructure.

The addition of court covers over three outdoor courts is therefore an essential upgrade to increase usable court capacity, improve programming reliability and provide greater protection from adverse weather conditions.



Covered courts would support more consistent training, competition and development opportunities across the year, helping Maroondah Nets meet current demand while supporting future participation growth.

**Addition of court covers over 4 outdoor netball courts to enable expanded programming.**

The Netball Victoria SWFS found that Wyndham City Council had a ‘Total Netball Court Demand Rating Score’ of 19/24, due to the Active Market Population’ (females 5–64 years) projected to increase by 31.3% and with more than 550 people per equivalent competition court. This indicates strong pressure on existing court provision.



The addition of court covers is therefore an essential upgrade to increase usable court capacity, enabling more reliable programming, training and competition opportunities without being significantly affected by adverse weather conditions.

The project will improve the overall participant experience by providing greater scheduling certainty for players, officials and clubs, while supporting year-round use of the facility. It will also enhance Eagle Stadium’s capacity to meet growing demand and host larger netball competitions and events across the region..

Redevelopment of existing outdoor court and development of an additional multi-purpose court, upgraded lighting and new shelters.

The Netball Victoria SWFS identified Mansfield Shire Council’s ‘Outdoor Court Capacity’ at just 47%, with poor court conditions and inadequate lighting limiting facility use and functionality. The redevelopment of the existing outdoor court and construction of a new multipurpose court will increase compliant court capacity, improve facility functionality and support expanded training, competition and community participation opportunities.



Upgraded lighting and shelters will enhance the experience for players, officials and spectators while supporting safer and more reliable use of the venue. This investment will help Bonnie Doon Recreation Reserve better meet local demand and provide a more accessible, fit-for-purpose facility for the community.

The Netball Victoria SWFS identified a shortage of compliant indoor competition courts in Greater Shepparton City Council area due to inadequate court run-off areas, court condition and line marking. Redeveloping the stadium will address these gaps, increasing court capacity, supporting participation growth, improving player experience, and enabling the region to host larger competitions and events.



The upgrades will deliver modern, fit-for-purpose facilities that better support local clubs, schools and community users, while strengthening Shepparton Sports and Events Centre’s role as a key regional sporting hub.

This investment will help meet growing demand for indoor court sports and attract major events that provide social and economic benefits to the region

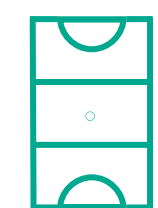

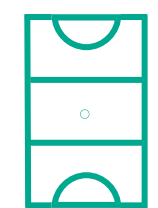

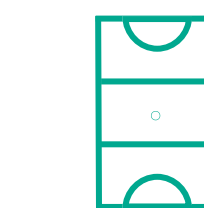

**Development of a new community hub to replace existing facility, including development of new female-friendly changerooms for players and umpires, function rooms, storage, first aid and utility rooms.**

The Skipton Recreation Reserve facilities are aging facilities over 40 years old and are no longer fit-for-purpose. This shovel-ready project would assist the community to support modified sports programming, and multi-functional social spaces.

The Netball Victoria SWFS identified that of the ‘Active Female Population’ in Corangamite Shire Council area, 11.9% were Netball



members. Due to this high active membership rate in Corangamite, this project is essential to meet the needs of these members by allowing greater access to compliant, female-friendly change facilities.

It will also encourage greater participation, particularly for women and girls in the area, by providing a venue which meets the demands of the sport and meets the needs of a growth area.

The development of a 16-court regional netball facility and supporting pavilion, will complement the existing 6-court indoor facility and strengthen participation across the Greater Geelong area. This project directly responds to the “Priority Development Opportunities” identified for Geelong in Netball Victoria’s SWFS 2026-2028, where a critical shortfall in court infrastructure was identified across the LGA.

The SWFS found that the City of Greater Geelong had a ‘Total Netball Court Demand Rating’ of 16/24, driven by an ‘Active Market Population’ (females aged 5–64 years) projected to increase by 17.4% to more than 120,000 people. This places significant pressure on existing court provision.

By increasing the number of compliant courts available for training, competition, tournaments and netball programs, the project will help meet current and future demand. In a growing area, it will enable clubs and associations greater flexibility expand programming and create more opportunities for participation.



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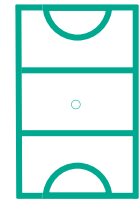

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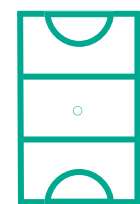

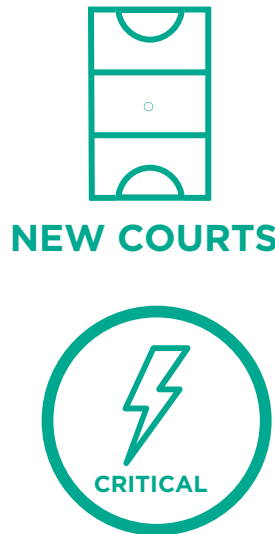

Demolish the existing outdoor netball court, storage building and part retaining wall, and construct two new outdoor courts with lighting, shelters, fencing and a large retaining wall.

The Netball Victoria SWFS found that Latrobe City Council LGA’s ‘Outdoor Court Capacity’ was only 49%, with non-compliant and poor-condition courts limiting participation and competition opportunities across the region. Constructing two new compliant netball courts at Ted Summerton Reserve will directly address this shortfall by increasing court capacity, improving playing conditions and supporting greater access to training, competition and community participation.

The proposed development will provide sustainable benefits for Moe Football Netball Club and the Gippsland League by delivering safe, compliant and fit-for-purpose facilities. It will strengthen the venue’s capacity to meet local demand, encourage greater participation - particularly among women and girls - and provide a facility that better reflects the needs of a growing netball community.

Increasing the venue from one court to two compliant courts will also create more flexibility for programming and scheduling. The upgrade will enable the club to offer NetSetGo and other Netball Victoria programs, deliver more training and competition opportunities, host junior and senior matches at the same venue on game day, and provide a dedicated warm-up court for teams.
